KANDOSOLS: Structureless soils

- Mostly well-drained, permeable soils although some Yellow and most Grey Kandosols have impeded subsoil drainage.
- Common in all States except Victoria and Tasmania. Most widespread in the arid and semi-arid interior.
- Used for extensive agriculture in the wheatbelt of southern New South Wales and south-west Western Australia. In the better-watered areas they are used for a range of horticultural crops.
- Most have low fertility and land use is restricted to grazing of native pastures.
- Grazing lands are susceptible to surface soil degradation such as hardsetting and crusting.
